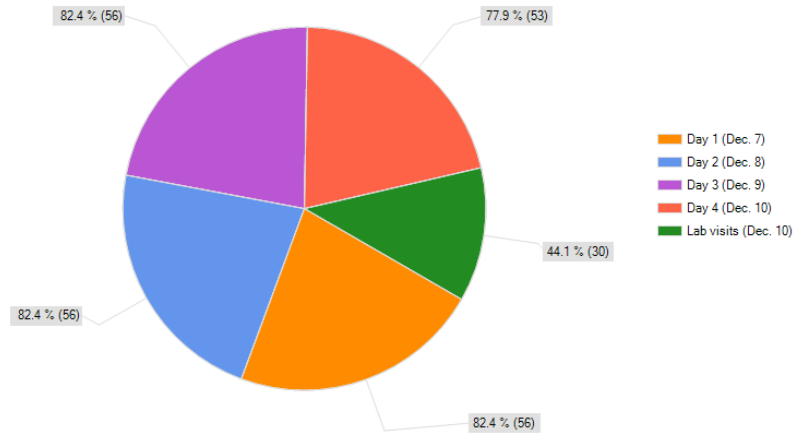
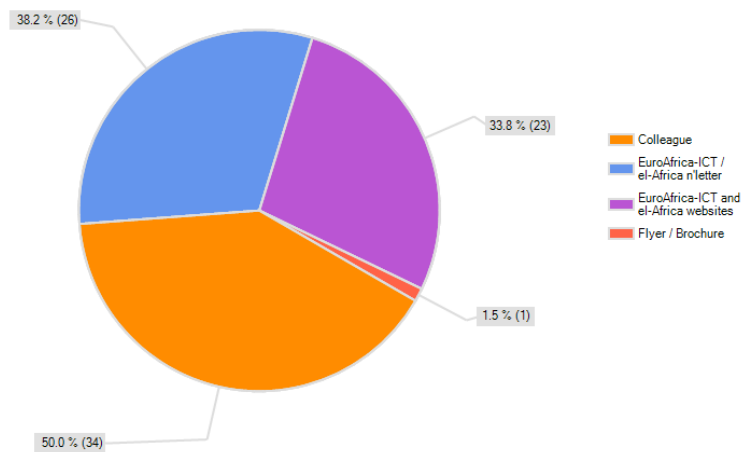

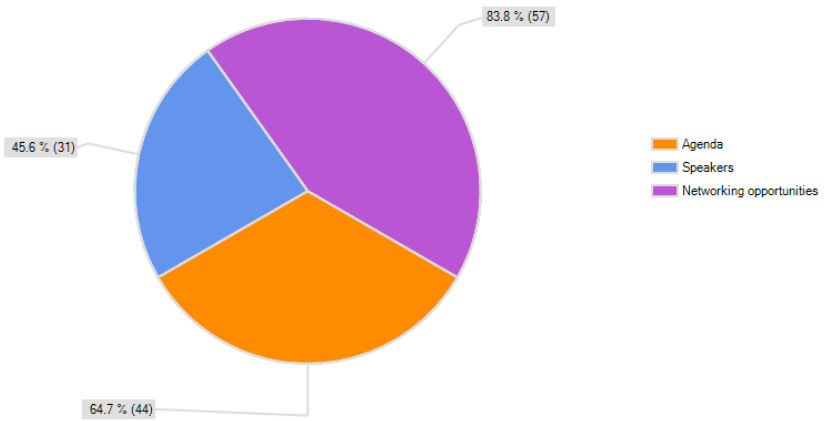


How did you hear about the Euro-Africa Week?

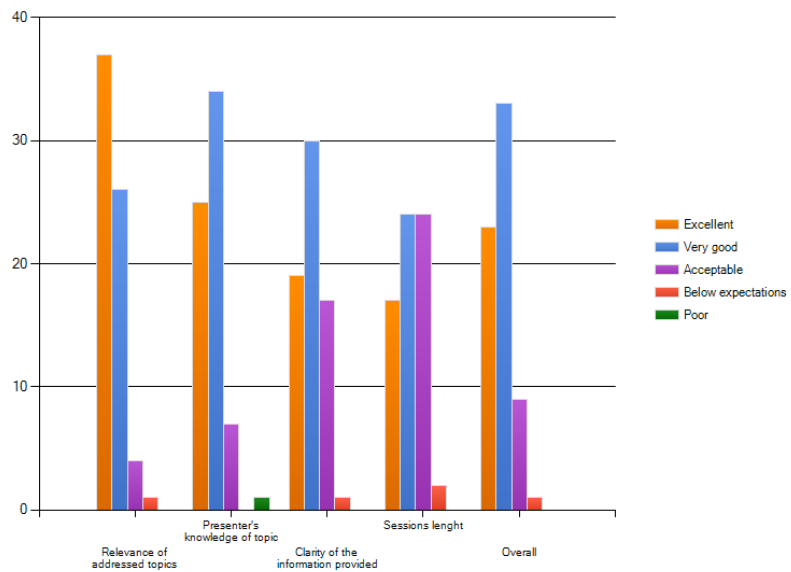




What attracted you to these events?

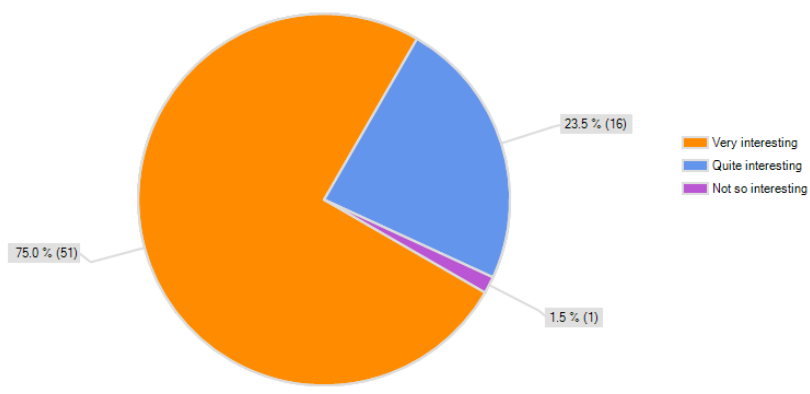


How do you rate the content of the event?

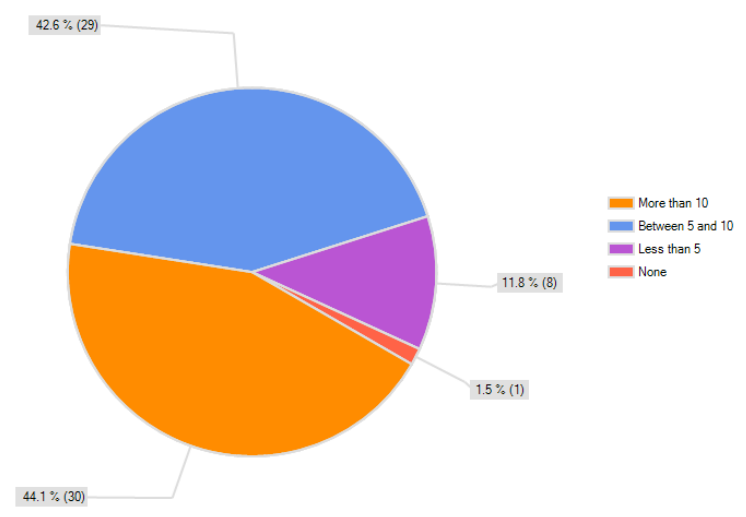




How would you assess the interest you have found participating in this event?

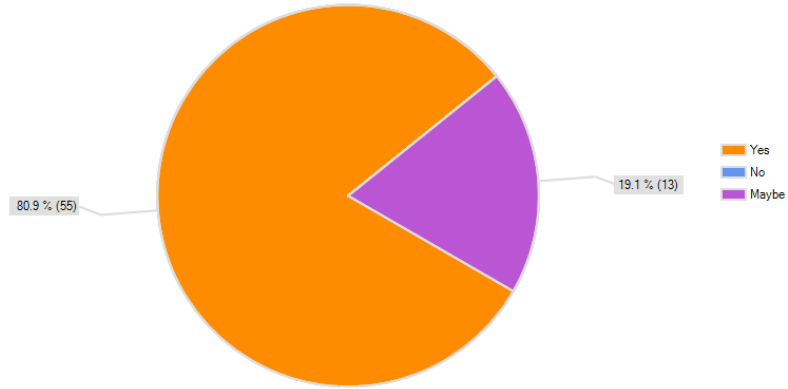


How many useful contacts have you established or strengthened during the meeting?

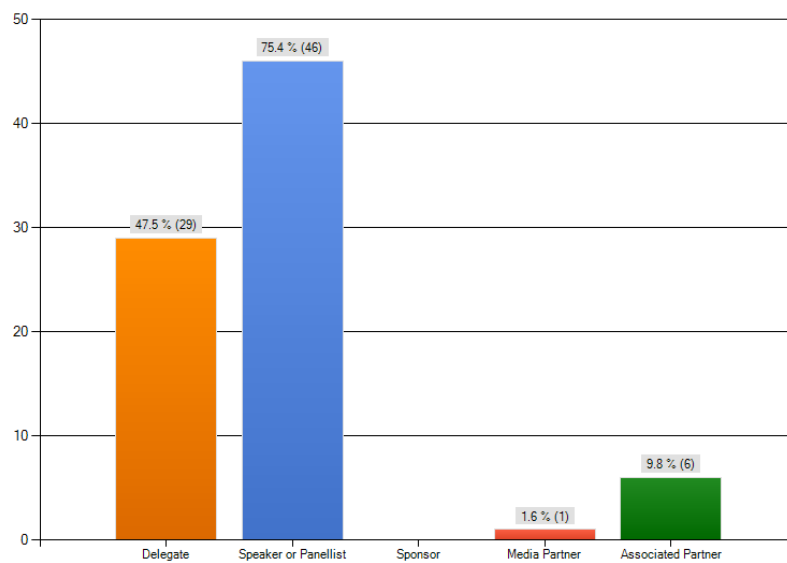




Do you plan to attend similar events again next year?

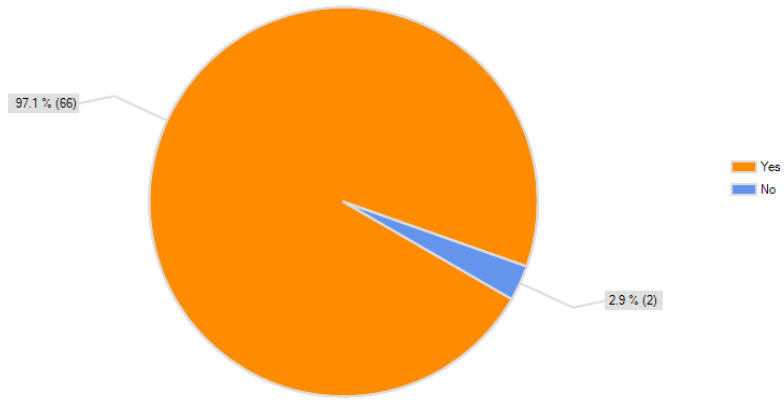


If so, do you plan to attend as a/an?

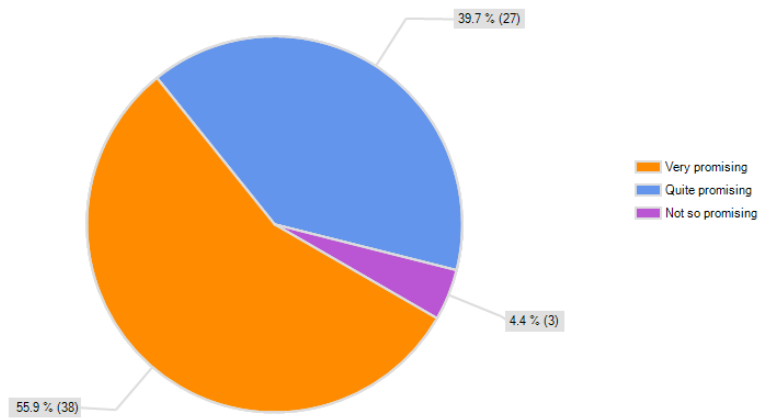

Conclusions from the organisers

- **The attendance during the four days of the Euro-Africa Week has been equally distributed**
- **50% of the respondents gained knowledge of the event by word of mouth, 38% through the newsletter and 33% by visiting the eI-Africa and EuroAfrica-ICT websites**
- **The majority of participants have been most attracted by the networking opportunities offered by the event. At the same time, a good percentage of them declared to be very interested in the agenda and in the quality of speakers**
- **From the analysis of the event content emerges that the relevance of addressed topics has been judged excellent. The presenter's knowledge of topics, the clarity of information provided and the session length has been considered very good**
- **98% of the respondents found the event very or quite interesting**
- **The meeting has been very fruitful in terms of networking: the majority of participants has established more than 10 contacts, 44% of them between 5 and 10, while only 11% of them established or strengthened less than 5 contacts**
- **81% of the respondents plan to attend next events, proving that the events have been very well appreciated**
- **75,4% of the respondents would like to attend the next event as a speaker or pannelist, demonstrating their will to actively participate and making their voice heard**
- **The event has been really successful: 97,1% of the participants would recommend this event to others**
- **The majority of participants feel that cooperation between Europe and Africa is very or quite promising. Only the 4,4% have a more negative view**
